We are greatly saddened to have just learned of the passing of our devoted treasurer and friend, **Dorothy Swackhamer**, on 6/17/02.

Washington Twp- Dorothy Swackhamer of the Long Valley section of Washington Township died Monday at Hackettstown Community Hospital in Hackettstown. She was 81. Born May 30, 1921, in the Mount Fern section of Randolph, she lived in Washington Township for many years. Mrs. Swackhamer was employed by Jersey Central Power and Light in Dover and later by the Long Valley Middle School as

a cafeteria aide. She had also worked at the Taylor's Dairy Store in Chester. She was the 1998 recipient of the Senior Citizen of the Year award and was an active member of the Golden Age Senior Group, the 50-Plus Seniors and the Senior Advisory Council. She enjoyed traveling with these groups immensely. A member of the Long Valley Presbyterian Church in Long Valley, she was very active in church activities, including the "Holy Folders" for over 50 years. She was a member of the Ladies Auxiliary Long Valley Fire Department, past member of the PTA, Girl Scouts, and 4-H clubs. She was the treasurer of the Swackhamer Dufford Genealogical Society, volunteered at the Washington Township Food Bank in Morris County and was a board member of the German Valley Cemetery Association. Her husband, Bert Jr., died in 1993. Survivors include two sons, Bert III of Long Valley and Guy of Hackettstown; two daughters, Linda Coates of Liberty and Sue Delgaizo of Mount Arlington; one brother, Norman Davis of Kerrville, Texas; and seven grandchildren. A memorial service will be held at Long Valley Presbyterian Church, 39 Bartley Road, Long Valley, on Saturday, June 29th at 10 a.m. Interment will be at the German Valley Rural Cemetery. Some very interesting articles were passed around which were sent to us by Diane Swackhamer from Ontario, Canada. These had some great information on the branch of the Swackhamers who went to Canada in the 1800's. We will try to post some of this soon.

A Belated Genealogical Tribute By James W. Swackhamer

In late August of 1994 I received a letter from Mrs. Lawrence Harris of Avoca NY giving me the details of what she knew of her family. At the time I was fighting arterial sclerosiss and eventual by-pass surgery while my wife was suffering with terminal ovarian cancer, so I set her letter aside. I just recently found the letter and called her to see if I could include her information in our Bulletin. I was sad to find that she had passed on, but her husband was gracious in allowing me to publish her information. Charlene (Swackhammer) Harris died 4 October 2000. What follows is from her letter and attachments, subject to some interpretation on my part.

Daniel Swackhammer born 10 Feb. 1845, buried in Montrose PA Cemetery. Married Delilah Davis, born 9 April 1855; died Dec. 1924, buried in Montrose PA Cemetery. Children:

Frank Swackhammer, born 8 Sept. 1875, died 24 November 1924.

Morris L. Swackhammer, born 15 April 1877 in Auburn, PA, died 16 Sept. 1953, (note conflict below), married Lottie Jones 20 March 1901. Lottie Jones died 10 Sept. 1960.

Llewellyn Swackhammer, born 28 March 1879, died 1945, married Rachel Jones, born 1881, died 1957.

Iva Swackhammer. Born 26 Feb. 1884, married (?) Sterling.

Mabel Swackhammer, born 13 Sept 1889, married (?) Shoemaker (an undesignated date of 5 April 1918 follows "Shoemaker").

Fay Swackhammer, born 14 May 1892

Morris L. Swackhammer, born 15 April 1877 in Auburn Township, PA, died 16 Feb. 1953 in Bath, NY, buried 20 Feb 1953 in Montrose, PA Cemetery; married Charlotte (Lottie) Jones 20 Mar 1901 in Montrose, PA. Charlotte Jones, the daughter of Nathan Jones (1840-1914) and Henritta Stockholm (1853-1906) was born 10 Dec 1879 in Neath, PA. She died 10 Sept 1960 in Bath,NY and buried 14 Sept 1960 in Montrose PA Cemetery. Both of her parents were buried in Neath, PA. They had one child, Roy L. Swackhamer

Roy L. Swackhammer, born 16 Jan 1903 in Montrose, PA, died 16 Mar 1971 in Hornell, NY, buried 20 Mar 1971 in Bath NY, Nondaga Cemetery, married Virginia L. Burelson 24 Jun 1924 in Savona, NY. Virginia Burelson was born 30 Sept 1902 in Eldred PA, the daughter of Frank G. Burelson and Roxie Douglas. She died 12 Feb, 1991 in Bath, NY and buried 16 Feb 1991 in Bath, NY Nondaga Cemetery. Children:

Frank B. Swackhammer, born 16 March 1925 in Afton, Chenango County, NY, died 14 July 1991, married Kathleen Clancy in 1945.

Charlene V. Swackhammer, born 12 Oct 1932 in Afton, Chenango County, NY, died 4 Oct. 2000, married 30 April 1952 to Lawrence Harris.

In her letter, Charlene Harris wrote that she did not know where Daniel and his wife were born or any other information about them. If anyone can add to the information outlined above, please send it to me and I will see that her husband and others receive all updates.

From Diane Swackhamer - Ontario, Canada

We are descendants of Christopher Swackhamer and his wife Elizabeth who resided in Grimsby. Christopher emigrated from Long Valley, NJ in the late 1700s, and during the War of 1812 he declared as a conscientious objector and his son Jacob undertook his service and acted as an orderly for General Brock. Jacob took up a land grant in the township of Esquesing in the 1820s and moved to Ontario with several of his brothers and sisters and their families.

Diane kindly sent a photocopy of an article from her local paper that featured the genealogy of local families. This was shared at last year's reunion. We hope to soon include this on the SD web site.

Reunion/Meeting Speaker 7/27/02

Nancy Schanes will be our guest speaker. Nancy spent ten years researching the Swackhamer family, especially their journey on the ship, the *Love and Unity*, and the troubles and court cases after that. She has a completed booklet and will bring it to show us also. If anyone is interested, she will have a few copies to sell for \$9. This promises to be a fascinating talk! From Russell Dufford – Russell has been continuing his diligent search this year for the birthplace and birth records of our original ancestor Phillip Dufford, and his son, Jacob. He mentions an excellent book which has helped him, Emigrants from the Northern Alsace, by Annette Burgert. He also sent a list, provided by a helpful librarian, of some Dufford names and addresses from Germany. He is starting to contact some of these people to see if they might be able to help in this search. The librarian thought that would be the best place to start, but also thinks that we were originally Swiss and fled into the Palatinate, possibly being from the same area of Switzerland (Canton Basel) as the Durrenberger (Terriberry), and Marty families. The Weise (Weiss) family was from there also and we married into all these families before coming to this country. We came on the same ship together and have married the same over generations. This librarian gave Russell some Swiss sources to check also. He will be bringing the list of possible German relations, and a form titled, "Letter to a possible relative", written in German (we just fill-in the blank names/addresses in English), to the reunion.
