In addition to the half-sister, David had 4 brothers—Peter, George, Louis and Samuel (a Civil War veteran) and two sisters, Anna and Rotola. Betty owns an old tin-type photo of David and three other men, most likely his brothers.

1-8-08 **Doyle Swackhamer** of Montrose, PA wrote to say that Diana C. Swackhamer has 11 g. grandchildren! Can anyone top that?

1-8-08 Laurin L. Henry, Charlottsville, VA, a retired professor is descended from Elizabeth Dickerson Dufford (1831-1913) and Andrew Bartles Henry (1824-1914). 55 Years Ago

The first combined reunion was held in Long Valley at Zion Lutheran Church on Saturday, July 25, 1953 and the initial bulletin was published. The Swackhamer-Dufford Genealogical Society has met on the last Saturday of July ever since and has a membership of 400.

Necrology

Mrs. Mary Swackhamer of Dundas, Ontario, Canada died in January 2007. Her daughter Joyce Swackhamer MacRae, also of Dundas, informed the Society within a couple of months but we had already printed the Summer 2007 <u>Bulletin</u> to get it out early because of the special reunion. Our Condolences are extended to Joyce and her family.

On January 19, 2008 **Howard E. Dufford** passed away in Hastings, Nebraska at the age of 94. He was preceded in death by his wife, **Viola B. "Vi" (Tippetts) Dufford** on August 6, 2006. Mr. Dufford was born Andrew Simshauer on January 17, 1914 in Miller, Nebraska, and was adopted by Loid L. and Lottie (Orton) Dufford, who gave him the name Howard Edward Dufford.

Howard graduated from Hastings High School in 1932 and married Viola on September 25, 1935. He worked as a salesman and warehouse price clerk for the Dutton-Lainson Company, as a senior administrative assistant in the construction of a Naval Ammunition Depot, and then sold windmills and farm machinery for Beatrice Nebraska Dempster Mill Industries. He retired in 1979 and continued an active life of community volunteer work, travel and many hobbies including square dancing and avid support of University of Nebraska football.

Survivors include daughter and son-in-law Karlay and Dr. Hutchins of Hastings and grandchildren and spouses: Thad and Rachel Hegwood of Omaha, Dr. Karry and Gordon Whitten of Omaha, and Trista and Kal Frederick of Sacramento, CA. Two step grandchildren include Barbara Hutchins of Minneapolis, MN and Robert and Vivian Hutchins of Tucson, AZ. The S-D Society extends condolences to the family.

Also passing on January 19, 2008 was **Kenneth Hunter**, beloved husband of **Angeline Place Hunter**. Kenneth was born in Miltom, Cumberland, England on August 3, 1921, to the late Isabella Brown and Thomas Hunter. Thomas immigrated to the Univited States in 1929 and Kenneth and his mother and sister followed in 1934. In 1942 he joined the U.S. Army, 95th Division, 358 Field Artillery Battalion.

Kenneth graduated from Penn State University in 1949 with a B.S in civil engineering. He worked briefly for the American Bridge Company in Elmira, NY, before returning to State College, PA to become a continuing education instructor in civil engineering until his retirement in 1984 as Associate Professor. At the time of his death he was a member of Chi Epsilon National Civil Engineering Society, The American Society of Civil Engineers, The American Society of Engineering Education and The Society of Land Surveyors.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by daughters **Jacqueline** and her husband **Gary Coble** of Dubois, PA, **Suzanne** and her husband **Thomas Park** of Tyrone, PA. He was preceded in death by his daughter **Barbara**

Bradley Woodfill. Kenneth is also survived by eight grandchildren, five great grandchildren and his only sister, **Joan** and her husband **James Wheeler** of Niantic, CN. The S-D Genealogy Society extends its sympathy to Angeline and her family.

James W. Swackhamer, (b. 7-13-20 Camden, NJ; d. 4-19-08 Wheaton, IL; age 87). Jim was the son of George Fremont and Romalda Stratton Swackhamer, and served as Swackhamer Family Historian Emeritus of the Swackhamer-Dufford Genealogical Society. Jim was preceded in death by his first wife, Lillian Louise Maxey Swackhamer, and is survived by his wife Betty Jane Miller Swackhamer of Wheaton, IL. Further surviving Jim are four daughters: Martha Heroux of Franklin, TN, Carolyn Ray of Paris, IL, Janet Hoekenga of Wheaton, IL and June Charlett of Oswego, IL. Also surviving are 9 grandchildren and 1 great-granddaughter.

Jim lived an active and productive life. He was featured in "Introducing Society Officers" in the Winter 2006 Bulletin. As a descendant of Samuel and family Revolutionary War veterans, Jim may be the only Swackhamer male inducted into SAR, Sons of the American Revolution. He had a life-long interest in family history and served our Society with distinction.

My first and last visit with Jim occurred on September 8, 2007. He was at that time in fine spirit, but declining health. He said how much he would have loved to have attended the 2007 reunion and dreamed of maybe having the strength to go in 2008, a dream that both of us knew was not likely. Jim will be missed. Hello fellow Dufford's. This ongoing project is an attempt to update our specific family line of the Dufford family tree so as to: 1) inform all living Dufford descendants of our heritage and 2) connect our RECENT ancestors back into Chambers book, <u>Early Germans of New Jersey</u>, so that they may be able to go forward and continue research of their specific lines. My great grandmother is <u>Mariah W. Dufford</u> (born in Hackettstown, NJ in early 1834, married Nelson Trimmer on 12/30/1854, and died on 12/16/1908). Both Mariah and Nelson are buried in the large family plot in Union Cemetery, Hackettstown, NJ. I **encourage all Duffords** to trace their present family back to one of the Dufford's listed in Chamber's book. This is a great way to learn about your family, connect to other Dufford relatives and contribute to both our Society and history in general.

Swackhamer Surname Project by Gene L. Swackhamer

The excitement is building as each new participant in this national study of male Swackhamer relatedness contributes one more piece to a genomic descendency chart from the first Samuel. Because the male Y-chromosome passes from grandfather to father to son to grandson unchanged, DNA analysis can extend back in time proving common ancestors. It is the most significant breakthrough in genealogy in decades.

The goal of the Swackhamer Surname Project with Family Tree DNA is to test a large sample of Swackhamer males from as many of Samuel's lines as possible. If those with traditionally proven descendency from Samuel match the DNA of those with unproven lineage, then there will be about 99% certainty that Samuel is our only national progenitor. Why not 100%? Remember the story of the *Love and Unity*. Samuel had other surviving family members that reached Holmes Hole, Mass., with him in 1731, but then disappeared following the trials. George, possibly Samuel's brother or nephew, may have populated a yet unknown line that would have the same DNA.

Reporting early successes. As a result of publishing the book, *The Emigration of Samuel Swackhamer and the Westward Migration of his Descendants*, I discovered **Todd Swackhamer** of Anderson, IN. He and his son Elijah, are the only known male descendants of Frank Swackhamer, who was born in Ohio and migrated with his family to Indiana in 1884. Frank and my grandfather Morris, were believed to be brothers. Todd and I have discovered that we have identical DNA at the 37 marker level, thus confirming a

MRCA (Elijah, father of Frank and Morris.) Further testing of Ohio, Missouri, Texas and California Swackhamers should reveal other connections. Just as we were going to press it was learned that Greg Swackhammer, Dundas, ON, Canada and Assistant Swackhamer Historian, matches both Gene and Todd at 36 of 37 markers. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that we share a common ancestor no longer ago than 14 generations. Since Greg knows that he is descended from (1) Samuel, (2) John and (3) Christopher, this is the first proof for Ohio origin Swackhamers that we are related to a line from Samuel and that the Canadian Swackhammers are related to Richard Stacy Hickman, originally from Pittsburgh, PA, now retired and living in FL, and I have an identical match at the 25 marker level. To the best of our knowledge we share no common ancestor in America, but we discovered that our respective surname origins came from the region along the Rhine River east of Speyer just a few miles apart! Somewhere there, perhaps 300 years ago, we have a common ancestor. Our DNA did not match at the 37 marker level.

Who can participate in this study? Any male Swackhamer may participate by ordering a saliva testing kit from Family Tree DNA. (www.familytreedna.com/public/SwackhamerSurnameProject) Other males with Swackhamer ancestry, but different surnames, also may want to participate. Although a maternal mitochondrial DNA test is possible, it is more complicated and women doing genealogical research often find that Y-DNA analysis can still

advance their findings, so they often convince a male relative to participate in surname testing projects. The test at the 37 marker level is recommended and is just under \$200.00 per person. Testing at the 37 marker level is designed to identify a common American ancestor, hopefully confirming Samuel. A 67 marker

test may become necessary at some point, but it seems too costly to justify at this time. <u>Come to the July 26, 2008</u>, <u>Swackhamer-Dufford Society reunion for a workshop update on this DNA study, the latest findings, and a free test kit for a lucky attendee.</u>
